This Indenture made and entered into this fifteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one Thousand Seven Hundred and ninety six. Between Simon Peter Cochrell alias Trapling of the County of Russell and State of Virginia of the one part and Peter Cochrell of the County of Prince Willm and state aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth that the said Simon Peter Cochrell for and in consideration of the sum of fifty Pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Peter Cochrell the receipt whereof the said Simon Peter Cochrell alias Trapling doth hereby acknowledge hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, and confirmed and doth by these presents grant, bargain, sell, alien & confirm unto the said Peter Cochrell his heirs and assigns, a certain tract or parcel of Land containing one Hundred acres more or less which was conveyed to the said Simon Peter Cochrell alias Trapling by Thomas Cottrill dec. by Deed of Gift recorded in the County Court of Prince William on the 25th day of November one Thousand Seven Hundred and fifty four, and by the said Simon Peter Cochrell conveyed to the said Peter Cochrell by Deed bearing date the Seventeenth day of September one Thousand seven Hundred and Seventy two. but which Deed was only proved by two witnesses and has this day been reacknowledged before John Williams, John Dorrock & Jeremiah Dowell & George Cochrell in order that it may be fully proved & recorded. Together with all houses, profits, advantages, hereditaments, ways, waters with the appurtenances of every kind and nature whatsoever thereunto appertaining, To have and to hold the aforesaid bargained premises with their appurtenances unto the said Peter Cochrell, and his heirs & assigns, to the only proper use and behoof of him the said Peter Cochrell and of his heirs & assigns for ever, and lastly the aforesaid Simon Peter Cochrell alias Trapling for himself his heirs, Executors, and Administrators doth warrant and forever defend the aforesaid bargained premises with their appurtenances unto the said Peter Cochrell and his heirs & assigns against all claims of any person or persons. ^{Whatsoever} In Witness whereof the said Simon Peter Cochrell alias Trapling hath hereunto set his hand and



said Simon Peter C^k alias Trapling for and in consideration
of the sum of twenty five pounds cur^t money of Virg: to
be paid by the said Peter Cockrell to this said alias Trapling
whereof this said alias Trapling do hereby acknowledge
have remised, released and for ever quit claimed and by these
presents do for him his heirs and assigns fully and absolutely
remise release and ever quit claim unto him the said Peter
Cockrell his wife in their full and peaceable possession - and
quiet being (and to his heirs, exors administrators and assigns
for ever all y^e estate right title Interest claim and demand
of a certain Tract of Land containing one hundred Acres
more or less situate lying and being in the County

Land that ever was left remaining of a greater patten
of land and was given to me alias Trapling by a Deed of
Gift of Thomas Cockrell Dec^r and recorded in Court y^e 25th
