This Deed made this twenty fifth day of March in the year one thousand eight
hundred and seventy one Between Thomas Jones and Martha Jones his wife of the first
part and George B. Jones the son of the parties of the first part of the second part
Witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of Two dollars and in further con-
sideration of the services of the said George B. Jones and in further consideration of
mutual love and affection the said Thomas and Martha Jones do grant unto the said
George B. Jones with general warranty all that certain tract or parcels of land lying
and being in the Township of Manassas County of Prince William and State of
Virginia containing one hundred and four and a half acres to the same more or
less (and is part of a larger tract known by the name of "Faston" devised by one
Redman Foster to the said Margaret Foster for life and at her death in fee to
the said Redman Foster) and is bounded as follows to wit: Beginning at a stone
post corner to Henry German & said Jones and running on a branch with on a
line with said Jones and Samuel Woolerton 171 rods to a stone post corner to said
Woolerton and thence 886¹ & 108 Rods to a stone post corner to said Woolerton
