

The “Furr House” was a two-story frame structure with many additions. According to Sarah Turner, Haymarket town historian, the house was built by William Jordan, when he owned the Beverly Mills. In 1905, Charles Furr Jr. purchased the mill, and immediately took up residence at the site. The house for many years stood vacant and was torn down sometime after 2001.
