DIED on the 14th instant, after a very short illness, at HAZELWOOD, Prince William County, Va. Doctor Richard S. Foote, aged 26 years. Doctor Foote was for many years a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and died calm and resigned, with the bright hope of a blissful immortality.

The Terms of sale will be CASH for the Negroes, and for the other property a credit of twelve months on all sums over \$10, the purchasers giving bonds, with good security, (the bonds to carry interest from the date, but to be remitted if the principal be punctually paid); for all purchases of \$10 and under, cash will be required. The property is not to be delivered until the terms of the sale are complied with.
