

Camp Spencer, Roane County, West Virginia  
March 27<sup>th</sup> 1864

This day Stephen S. Glaze made oath before the undersigned that B. C. Dewees & Daniel Dusky, who are now held as prisoners of war by the U. S. authorities are reputed and are notorious bushwhackers, that on the night of the 14<sup>th</sup> Sept. 1863 the said Glaze in company with Eli Rogers, Marshall W. Glaze and John McMullin at the house of Henry Glaze were surrounded & Dewees ordered the house burned over them & then commenced shooting in the house, by which they mortally wounded John McMullin & Marshall W. Glaze, and on the same night they went about two & one half miles from where this tragedy occurred and there as reported which he believes to be true the same men or rangers killed by shooting a black girl belonging to Mr. Wm. \_\_\_\_\_.
