That they believe from the evidence and surrounding circumstances the deceased came to his death by hanging himself to a limb of a tree, while laboring under a temporary aberration of mind. The evidence of Miss Sarah Davis concerning the deceased avers that he showed symptoms of insanity for two or three weeks past, worse the evening before his death. On one occasion said he wanted to die. Left the house about an hour by sun without his shoes.

The evidence of John Taylor concerning the deceased before the coroner & jury he considered him insane, was sent for about 8 o'clock found the deceased hanging to a limb of a tree in the woods back of the house about 12 o'clock.

I believe from the evidence and surrounding circumstances that the deceased Charles L. Davis came to his death by hanging himself while laboring under temporary aberration of mind.
