Commonwealth of Virginia vs French Wall Prince William County to Wit:

To Elias E. Conner, constable of the said county. For as much as William P. Foster has this day complained on oath before me L. B. Butler a Justice of the said County that French Wall of the said County, did on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of March 1866, threaten, that he would whip him and did throw stones at him and also committed a trespass by removing rails from his plantation, and has required surety, of the peace of the said French Wall. I command you in the name of the Commonwealth of Virginia forthwith to apprehend the said French Wall and bring him before me or some other Justice of said County, to answer the said complaint.

Given under my hand and seal the 6<sup>th</sup> day of March 1866 L. B. Butler, J.P. (seal)

This complaint was heard and the defendant required to recognize himself in the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars with one surety in the like sum to keep the peace and be of good behavior for the term of twelve months from this day and to pay sixty cents the costs of this complaint and he having found the surety required and paid the costs, is discharged.
