Doyle & Company's shop in Fredericksburg in the month of September next, at which place said Doyle & Company agree to furnish a Mill which shall be good, in exchange therefore.

August 21, 1852

Cooper, constable of Prince William County – Greetings: You are commanded to summon Milton Fitzhugh to appear before me or some other Justice of the Peace for said County, at Brentsville on the 19th day of January 1856 to answer the complaint of T. J. Doyle & Company for the non-payment of sixteen dollars and 78 cents, with interest, due by note. Given under my hand this 25th day of December 1856

Judgment is granted the plaintiff for the sum of sixteen dollars and 78 cents with interest thereon from the 4th day of November 1854 till paid, with 30 cents costs. Given under my hand this 15th day of March 1856 A. Howison

The Commonwealth of Virginia to B. Cooper, constable of Prince William County – Greetings: you are hereby commanded that of the goods and chattels of Milton Fitzhugh you cause to be made the sum of sixteen dollars and 78 cents with interest thereon from the 6^{th} day of November 1854, till paid: which T. J. Doyle & Company before A. Howison one of the Commonwealth's Justices of the Peace for said County, hath recovered against him for debt; also 30 cents for costs in that suit expended; and that you have the said debt and costs before the said Justice within sixty days, to render unto the said T. J. Doyle & Company his debt and costs aforesaid, and have then there this writ. Given under my hand this 15^{th} day of April1856.
