George B. Seymour a native of England, this day applies to the Court to be admitted to become a citizen of the United States, the said George B. Seymour having resided in the United States for three years next preceding his arriving to the age of twenty one years, having continued to reside therein to this time and having resided therein for five years, and declares on oath and proved to the satisfaction of the court by the oaths of John C. Weedon that for three years next preceding it has been his bona fide intention to become a citizen of the United States, and also proved by the said witness that during that time he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the constitution of the United States and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same, he the said George B. Seymour thereupon, declares, on oath, in open court, that he will support the constitution of the United States, and that he doth absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiances and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty whatever, and particularly to Victoria Queen of Britain and Ireland and thereupon, the said George B. Seymour is admitted a Citizen of the said United States.
