"A two-story, four-bay, brick-and-frame house, Locust Bottom has a metal-covered gabled roof. Its design is unusual in that the two windows opposite each other in the west rooms on both floors are placed flush with the west wall of the hall. There are two separate stairways to the second floor. Good interior trim, including four Federal mantels, chair rail, and stairways, remain. In the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, a two-story, frame "L" containing one room per floor was added to the rear of the house. In recent years, Locust Bottom has been the site of a horse-breeding farm."
