To Be Held at Sudley Church, Bull Run Battlefield, Tuesday

Manassas, Va., and Aug.5 – Many Washingtonians have signified their intention to attend the Methodist Jubilee Picnic, to be held at Sudley Church on the Bull Run Battlefield, Tuesday at 11 a.m.

Bishop Hendrix, senior bishop of the Southern Methodist church, will be one of the guests of honor, together with the Rev. John F. Goucher, of Baltimore, founder of the Goucher College for women in that city, who will personally represent Bishop Earl Cranston, senior bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church, who will not be able to attend the jubilee on account of ill health.

Automobile parties from Washington can reach Bull Run by 9 or 9:30 o'clock, which will give them an hour or two to visit the battlefield before attending services at Sudley Church.

This church was used as a hospital by both armies at the time of both battles of Bull Run, and is the only church on the battlefield.
