Be it remembered that on the 4th day of August 1877 Thomas W. Lion and J. E. Smith of the said county, personally appeared before me A. W. Sinclair a Justice of the Peace of the said county and severely acknowledged themselves to owe to the Commonwealth of Virginia, that is to say the said Thomas W. Lion the said sum of fifty dollars, and the said J. E. Smith the sum of fifty dollars to be respectively made & levied of their several goods & chattels, lands & tenements, if he the said Thomas W. Lion shall make default of the conditions underwritten.

The conditions of the above recognizance is such that if the above bound Thomas W. Lion shall keep the peace and be of good behavior towards all the citizens of this Commonwealth and especially towards Summer Lion for and during the terms of six months from the day hereof, then this recognizance shall be void, otherwise to remain in full force & virtue.
