This small, two-story, I-shaped, frame house is three bays wide and one bay deep, with a side-passage plan. There is a two-story, gabled-roofed, frame addition that was added to the rear of the house in the 1920s. The house is thought to have been the residence of George Trimmer, a turn-of-the-century miller in Manassas who operated a grist mill on Flat Branch, just north of the center of town on Main Street. The house has been moved; its present location, which may have been the site of Trimmer's Mill, is a few yards north of its site.
