"Today's church incorporates four different building periods. The original church (now a parish hall) was moved from the first high, one-story, gable-roofed, frame structure built between 1872 and 1879 to a second one-story, brick, worship house, which was designed by prominent architect Albert Speiden, and built in 1922. At the same time, the old and new churches were joined by a one-story connecting wing. In 1951 a second story was added to the rear of the church. In 1972 Trinity Episcopal Church celebrated its one-hundredth anniversary in Manassas and the fiftieth anniversary of the dedication of the present building."
