Several architectural features, including a three-story water tower and a series of rear service rooms at the back, distinguish this two-story, frame house. The property previously had a windmill and is one of the few homes in the city of Manassas with a still-standing carriage house. Westwood Hutchison, owner of Egypt, built this house when he became the first clerk of the National Bank of Manassas. An example of a banker's turn-of-the-century suburban residence, the house is in good condition and relatively unchanged from its original design. The water tower, carriage house, vanished windmill, and several other architectural details illustrate how some of the more practical aspects of daily living were handled at the turn of the century in Manassas.
