\$40 On or before the first of January next (1853) we promise to pay William J. Weir, his heirs or assigns, the sum of FORTY DOLLARS for the hire of servant Mary for the present year & to furnish the said servant with a good & substantial suit of summer & winter clothing, three shifts, one good pair winter stockings, one good pair winter shoes & one pair summer shoes, a good bonnet & blanket. The said servant to be well treated in every respect.

To all of which we bind ourselves, our heirs & jointly & severally by these presents. As witness our hands & seals this 1<sup>st</sup> day of January 1852

A Judgment for William Weir was made in with the following note:

1 January 1853 – By this sum given to Mary at sundry times, five dollars. By deduction from this note of Mary's services say from 1<sup>st</sup> December 1852 to 25 December at which time she came home to have her child – five dollars to be deducted.
